Issues/Ideas brought up during meeting and action plan:

Wetherby Burger – This meeting was dedicated to the ‘Wetherby Burger’. School Council were very fortunate to have Tony from IMS of Smithfield attend the meeting and explain where the meat that is supplied to Wetherby comes from. 


