

Dear Parents,

Welcome back and welcome to, Wetherby Prep 2018/2019.

I hope your boys have had an enjoyable week. From our perspective, they have done remarkably well, adapting to new procedures at lunch and at playtimes. What has always been a logistically challenging school, with so much going on, just got that little bit more challenging this year but the staff and boys adapted and managed everything without fuss, showing great efficiency, adaptability and organisation.



The building work next door has not been without its difficulties, inevitable when considering it has been vacant for almost twenty years, and I must give all credit to City Axis, the building contractors, who have done an exceptional job getting the basement converted and to the Alpha Plus Group for committing to such a project in the first place, embracing our desire to make a very successful school, even better. The work goes on in the background and we look forward to seeing it evolve as the term progresses.

Mrs Brookes writes...

Curriculum Guides

Attached to the Wetherbuzz are the Lower School and Upper School Curriculum Guides. The guides are put together by the Heads of Department to keep you fully informed as to what your son will be learning this year. It also includes advice on what textbooks boys might be using.

CATs testing

Parents may have noticed in the calendar card that boys will be completing CATs tests over the next couple of weeks. The *Cognitive Abilities Test (CAT)* is a suite of tests that assesses a student's reasoning (thinking) abilities in key areas that support educational development and academic attainment. It is not possible to revise for the tests and it is not something for boys to worry about. The results of the tests provide us with a deeper understanding of boys' learning styles and for older boys they are a useful data point for Senior School admissions.

There are four elements to the tests:

Verbal Reasoning – thinking with words, includes verbal classification and analogies

Quantitative (or Numerical) Reasoning – thinking with numbers, including number analogies and number sequences

Non-verbal Reasoning – thinking with shapes, including figure classification and figure matrices

Spatial Ability Battery – thinking with shape and space, including figure analysis and figure recognition

Mouthguards

This term from the week commencing 20th November your son will be playing Rugby at in Games lessons. I am writing to advise you, as our school policy is that all pupils in Year 4 to Year 8 must wear a mouthguard for matches and lessons. This is in line with guidelines set out by the Rugby Football Union (RFU).

In order to facilitate this we have arranged for OPRO who are approved the National Dental Mouthguard Association, to come into Wetherby Preparatory School and take impressions for custom fitted mouthguards. OPRO will take impressions on the mornings of the 12th (Y4, Y6 and Y7) and 13th September (Y5 and Y8).

Please note the following:

* All boys will receive a Mid-Impact Clear mouth guard at a cost of £39.99 added to your school bill unless you opt-out by emailing the full name of your child together with their form class to optout@oprogroupp.com.

* You can upgrade to another design or type at an additional cost. The designs and types can be seen at <http://mouthguards.opro.com/custom-colours-and-designs>. If you wish to upgrade please email the full name of your child together with their form class to optout@oprogroupp.com.

* The deadline to opt-out or upgrade is Sunday 10th September. After this point you will be charged for a Mid-Impact Clear mouthguard at the cost of £39.99. If choosing to opt-out it is suggested that you have received independent professional advice in coming to this decision.



Rwanda Trip

It has been great coming back to school and hearing all of the boys talking about their summer holidays. Mr Billingham, Mr Lock, Mr Metherell, Miss Phoenix and I were equally keen to talk about our time in Rwanda. For new boys and parents, Rwanda Aid is the 'away' charity that we support. For our final day in Kamembe, we were very grateful to have the opportunity to visit some of the Rwanda Aid projects. This included some of the enterprise projects, Baho Neza Mwana (the street children project), Ngwino Nawe (a school for children with disabilities) and also a farming initiative supported by Rwanda Aid. The Wetherby team all had a fantastic week helping to support some of the Rwanda Aid initiatives. It is a huge privilege to help in a small way with their fantastic work and we look forward to our continued support of Rwanda Aid in the coming year.




English Department

Before we get started, let me introduce myself, I am the Director of Sport at Wetherby Preparatory School. I am looking forward to getting to know your boys and teaching them this year. Please see below important information on Franchise Football and www.wetherbyprepsport.co.uk.

Franchise

Following a successful year of Franchise Sport, I am delighted to say that we are going to continue this term with the ever popular 'Wetherby Premier League' This will be for all boys who have not been selected in the school team and will be a series of 'intra-school' organised fixtures, resulting in a winner for the Seniors, the Under 11s, Under 10s and Under 9s which will be announced in the final sports assembly. If your son is not selected into a football team, he will then be placed into a draft, where the members of staff will pick 4-6 teams dependant on their year group. Each member of staff will coach the same team throughout the year and will be there at every fixture (it's really a competition between the teachers!) All parents are invited to watch the matches, there will be a tea afterwards and the results read out in Friday assembly.

If your son is not selected initially for the for regular fixtures against other schools, he can still be chosen for later games. We will assess the boys each week and make changes accordingly. The boys will however not be able to move between franchises (a Bulldog cannot become a Hawk!) We want the 'intra-school' matches to be as competitive as possible and for the boys to have a real passion for their teams, whether that be playing for the Under 10B team or indeed the 'WPS Rangers'.





