

# From the Headmaster

Dear Parents,

Where did that half term go? Only seems like last week when we were welcoming new boys to the School; how fast things move at Wetherby Prep.

It has been a thoroughly enjoyable and successful first half of term and the boys have achieved much, both in and out of the classroom. I would like also to make special mention of not just the new boys but our new staff, who have also settled in remarkably well. 






# RS Department
