8.	Sophie imagines the wolf:  it only seems to be there for a moment; it might just be the mist; it is hard to make it out ('the shape of the shape of')  no-one else reacts ('Why weren't they running?') so no-one else sees it she might be mistaken: when she turns back, there is no wolf ('There was nothing there')  the wolf is real:  'This was a real, white wolf', not a wolf from 'a mere story'  very vivid description of it: 'His eyes looked red against the white of the snow'  Sophie has a very intense, fearful and shocked reaction to it: 'With a wave of panic'; she 'couldn't move, couldn't speak'  Sophie makes a powerful mental connection with it: she knows intimate details about its lifestyle, its character, its abilities, and the bond connecting it to its environment; she feels drawn to it  the wolf seems to be looking right at her the horse reacts to it ('horse fretting and stamping')	5	1 mark for each point, or 2 marks for a point well made, up to a maximum of 5 accept either response or a mixture
