# **Dr Aric Sigman Talks**

On Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September, Dr Aric Sigman will be delivering the following talks to your sons during the school day:

Years 3 and 4 (one hour): Being kind and making friends. E-Safety and managing screen time (including gaming).

Years 5 and 6 (one hour): Doing your best in exams. Body image and pressures of physical appearance.

# Years 7 and 8 (one hour):

Body image and pressures of physical appearance. Leaving school and beyond.

Dr Aric Sigman lectures primarily to children and adolescents in schools on PSHE topics. He publishes peer-reviewed medical papers on PSHE topics ranging from alcohol and addictions, body image, screen time, to sex and relationships. He is the co-author of 4 recent Parliamentary Group reports on childhood mental health. Here is his website: <u>www.aricsigman.com</u>.

That evening at 7pm, he will deliver an online webinar to interested parents and staff. This talk will be called 'Raising Sons' and I will send a zoom link nearer the time. Aric believes that despite

the recent emphasis on gender neutrality and sexual equality, raising boys is not the same as raising girls. Everyone wants their sons to grow up healthy, happy, safe, and able to have good relationships. This talk will look at some of the contemporary issues and pressures boys face and how parents can support them. I hope to see you at this talk and please do let me know if you have questions.
